




#### **Boston Picnic**

## Youth Retreat - Chester, NY - June 2023

During the YJA convention in 2022, Kutchi youth overflowed the room during the Kutchi meet-up, brimming with energy to continue their Kutchi initiatives. This energy catalyzed a group consisting of Reeya Vora, Sangeet Dharamsey, Jubin Shah, and Janak Shah, who spent 10 months planning the Kojain Youth Retreat. Thirty-five Kutchi Jain youths gathered in rural Chester, NY for the second-ever retreat. These Kutchi youth hailed from ten states, ranging in age from budding high schoolers to professionals. With a spacious yard, heated pool, and ample shared spaces, the house provided an ideal setting to forge unforgettable memories with new friends and connect over shared Kutchi heritage.

On the first day, many attendees didn't know each other and arrived after tiring commutes. To break the ice, we organized various activities to facilitate introductions and get acquainted. As people began to know each other, the initial fatigue was replaced with excitement, and the retreat was off to a great start. One of the retreat's highlights was the food, which always included filling Jain and vegan options. For the first dinner, we were graciously donated Chole, roti, and rice by Renu Vora and Kavita Gada from Connecticut. After this delicious meal, we had a welcome session where we discussed our motivations for attending the retreat and our respective gaams (ancestral villages), with Bidada and Devpur being the most popular ones. It was during this session that we realized the youth's desire to stay connected to Kutch and Kojain, as we want our generation and the next to maintain our mother tongue and community. Following the session, we distributed the wonderful custom-engraved Kutchi retreat sweatshirts and enjoyed a lively game of Kachuful (Judgement) with Boots's Masala Popcorn before settling in for the night.

The next morning, after a hearty breakfast, the group ventured to the nearby Heritage Trail for a pleasant nature walk. Picture 35 Kutchi youth walking together, occupying the entire width of the trail. Upon returning to the house, a large group assembled in a line to make masala sandwiches, and we had a fun-filled barbecue. We then moved on to the group's favorite activity, the Kutchi Art session. Anand and Umed Maru from Queens, NY, delivered an amazing presentation and demonstration on two Kutchi art forms: Lippan Kam and Ajrakh block printing. Lippan Kam is a Kutchi art form that utilizes mud/clay and mirrors to adorn a home's interior, while Ajrakh Block printing involves block prints used for textile decoration. Participants displayed their creativity by crafting intricate patterns or even incorporating the Air Jordan logo.

After the art session, we made use of the heated pool. Rain or shine, everyone jumped in and had a great time swimming. We then indulged in a pizza party, featuring a variety of pizzas ranging from white to margherita to eggplant parmigiana. Following the feast, we engaged in an amazing murder mystery game, organized by Kreena Vora from New York, NY. Each participant was assigned a character, and the objective was to determine the "murderer." People fully embraced their roles, leading to lively and playful debates.

The following morning, we had the honor of hosting Vivek Maru, the founder and CEO of the non-profit organization Namati, based in Washington, DC, as our keynote speaker. Vivek has dedicated the past 25 years to environmental and legal work in Kutch and globally. His impactful efforts in reforming environmental practices, such as in factories, have resulted in significant achievements. Vivek's story captivated the group, and his relatability as a US-born individual resonated with most attendees. This inspired everyone to find opportunities to volunteer remotely for organizations in Kutch, and the Kutchi Youth will collaborate with Vivek in the future to partner with such Kutchi organizations. The next major event was the Kutchi Shark Tank, where participants were prompted to propose significant initiatives to sustain Kutchi culture in America over time. The winning group, "Kutchi EZ," proposed translating children's picture books into Kutchi, allowing children to absorb the language from an early age, along with creating audio supplements. It was

fascinating to see that all the groups' ideas aimed to preserve the language or organize group trips to Kutch. To explore the Jain aspect of our heritage, we conducted an ethical dilemmas session, where groups debated topics such as impossible vegan meat and having a pet at home from both Jain and personal perspectives. We then played "Capture the Gaam," a game of capture the flag, with all 35 attendees coming together in our spacious backyard. Since it was the last night, everyone was determined to bond. We enjoyed an amazing bonfire with vegan s'mores, a late-night swimming session, and a massive game of dumb charades. Some attendees stayed up the entire night playing games.

The next morning, we gathered for an amazing pancake breakfast, bidding heartfelt goodbyes to one another. We extend our gratitude to the donors who made this retreat possible. Countless hours were invested in planning, from transportation logistics to the day's schedule, food, and more. # Focus on Foreign Education - Update from KVOSS - By Lax Kenia, Mumbai

Every year many graduate students from KVO Samaj aspire for foreign education. Most of them for Post Graduate studies but some who can afford higher costs aspire for Undergraduate studies too. Some really want to pursue higher education in a chosen field but others do it for career goals, better job prospect, for the opportunity to explore foreign country, some for better looking Resume and better prospect for marriage.

Regardless of reason Total aspirational number post covid exceeds 100-150 students wanting to explore education overseas. Countries preferred by KVO students are USA, Canada, UK, Germany, Australia, New Zealand, Ireland, and Singapore etc. In most of these places kutchi people live and as such KVOSS tries to make aspirants life easy by sharing the Network of such residents.

On Saturday April 22,2023 Shree KVO seva samaj (KVOSS) held their annual session on foreign education to enlighten students and parents of current scenario, visa situation, job prospects in foreign countries, returning of KVO students due lack of job and worsening scenario of inflation, cost of tuition and stay overseas etc.

Visa situation in USA was highlighted by chief guest advocate Dr. Sudhir shah in his presentation. Dr. Ela Dedhia and I shared words of wisdom pointing out our many years of experience in the field and interaction with KVO students overseas as well as our counter parts in USA KOJAIN, UK, Canada and other countries. We shared our KVO resources such as WhatsApp groups of students from each year since 2016 host family system, KVO No interest education loans availability etc.

WE shared resources of the commercial educational loans but suggest them to refrain from saving one or two percent rates by offering your house or important assets as collateral. You may save small amount of interest expense but as in worst case scenario it may jeopardize your parent's lifestyle and livelihood. Bank and financial institution go out all the way to recover their funds, even to take over family assets making parents and grandparents life miserable. So be careful. Instead opt for NON COLATERAL LOAN OPTIONS.

country for education, Lifestyle in foreign country, education loan resources, initial adjustment in foreign country including caution on loneliness /Depression possibilities, 20 hours permissible job on campus versus hard work needed to cope up with studies. Personal security concern and the need to be street smart in new country was highly emphasized on. Use of alcohol and refrain from drug usage or watching child pornography being illegal and punishable by jail term was also highlighted. **KOJAIN's host family program and its dos and don'ts were emphasized** upon including wait till August month (near your departure dates) to communicate with Host family. Also do your sufficient research with Google map to understand geography of town you are going to study and living etc. Host families are also very busy in their life, as such do be selective in seeking help. Important message was GO for registered and recognized colleges rather than NEW or Unknown in studies and education. No one will offer job readily to graduate from unrecognized institutions.

Five KVO recent graduate panelists were selected to share their views on subject like college admission process, selection of

#### **KOJAIN Elections**

It is that time of the year again and it is time to elect new KOJAIN BOD that will serve the 2024-2025 term. Please see below announcement from the KOJAIN Election committee for nominations.

We have been successful in last few years to find new and enthusiastic community members to serve on the KOJAIN BOD, we urge everyone to come forward and be part of KOJAIN BOD representing your region.

#### Dear KOJAIN Members:

In accordance with the provisions of the constitution of KOJAIN, an Election Committee (EC) is constituted to conduct the election for electing the next Board of Directors for a period of two-year term, which will begin on **January 01, 2024** and end on **December 31, 2025**.

Enclosed is a nomination form for the election of various positions of the Board of Directors. In addition to electing a President, a Vice-President, a secretary, and a Treasurer; we need to elect eleven Regional Directors, one from each of the following regions:

Region 1	Arizona, Colorado, Hawaii, New Mexico, Southern California (South of 35 degree N Latitude), Utah, Mexico.
Region 2	Alaska, Idaho, Washington Montana, Nevada, Northern California (North of 35 degree N Latitude), Oregon, Wyoming.
Region 3	Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Oklahoma, Texas.
Region 4	Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wisconsin.
Region 5	Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, Tennessee.
Region 6	Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio, Western Pennsylvania (West of 77 degree Longitude), West Virginia.
Region 7	Maryland, North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, Washington (District of Columbia).
Region 8	Delaware, Eastern Pennsylvania (East of 77 degree longitude), New Jersey.
Region 9	New York.
Region 10	Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Vermont.
Region 11	Canada

The current office holders are also eligible to be nominated for this election, with the condition that the officers shall not hold the same position for more than two (2) consecutive terms.

Those interested in serving on the Board of Directors for any one of the available positions for the term ending on **December 31, 2025** should have at least one such form completed and returned to Mr. Raj Shethia, Chairman of the EC. These forms could be sent through email as an attachment of completed scanned or photographed form, by **September 12, 2023**. The nomination forms received after this date shall not be considered valid. **The email address is rajshethia@hotmail.com** 

The election of Youth Representative Director is outside the scope of this EC.

A valid nomination must satisfy all of the following requirements (Ref. Article #8.5.4):

- a. The nominee shall be a member of the KOJAIN in good standing on July 1, 2023.
- b. The nominee shall contest for only one position.
- c. The nominee for any officer's position shall be proposed by at least two (2) KOJAIN members who are in good standing on **July 1, 2023.**
- d. The Regional Director shall be a resident of the region from which s/he is contesting the election. The Regional Director nominee shall be proposed by at least two members of the same region from which s/he is contesting the election.
- e. Each nominee shall submit, in writing, his/her acceptance as a candidate to contest the election and serve, if elected.
- f. The nominee for the position of President must have served as a KOJAIN Director for a minimum of two (2) years.

If no election is required, then the EC will announce the names of the newly elected Board of Directors.

If there is more than one nomination for any of the post, following process and schedule will be applied to the best of our ability:

Applicants will be able to withdraw their nomination by requesting by email, to the Chairman of EC on or before October 10, 2023. If an election is required for any of the positions, the EC will prepare and mail out ballots, as well as the applicable election rules, to all the eligible voting members, by October 31, 2023.

Each contesting candidate may furnish a short (up to 200 words) biographical sketch including the record of his/her service to non-profit organizations, professional associations, etc. to the chairman of EC. Since EC will mail out this profile along with Ballot to electorates, it highly encourages contesting candidates to furnish the profile.

Exact number of copies of the profile to be supplied will be notified later to the contesting candidates. <u>Any properly voted original ballot postmarked or received by the chairman of EC on or before **November 28, 2023** shall be considered valid for <u>counting</u>. The EC will conduct opening and counting of ballots on or about **December 07, 2023.**</u>

Online voting as an alternative option to mail in ballots is being evaluated and will be advised by mid October 2023.

Location and time for opening and counting of ballots will be announced later to the candidates contesting the election. Contesting candidates may attend the ballot opening and counting in person or through their representatives. The EC shall tabulate and submit results of the election to the Board of Directors at the earliest possible date.

The newly-elected Board of Directors shall take over on January 1, 2024.
